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1. If you could sum up this last week with only one word, what would that word be?
  
2. Your salvation means that we are in Partnership with God.
  - a. Discuss what partnership means from our perspective
  
  - b. Now discuss what partnership means from God's perspective
  
3. Read 1 Corinthians 11:24-26
  - a. Why does Jesus ask us to remember His 'broken body' every time we take communion?
  
  - b. What does it mean to 'Proclaim the Lord's death till He comes'?
  
  - c. What is the purpose of that proclamation?
  
4. Using **one** of the verses over this page, describe something that stands out to you.
  
5. Using what you have just described, turn that into a prayer of thanks and declaration.
  
6. Pray for any needs around your table, then together, take communion as a declaration of your covenant partnership with God.

**Homework:** Take communion every day for the next 7 days. You can do it on your own, with someone, or even with your whole family. Use that time to teach your children about the 'power of partnership' with God. Do it to reinforce what you have learned today. Make it a spiritual declaration! Every need you have, bring it before God in prayer and then take communion, declaring your covenant partnership with God.

Make a note of how your week is different through taking communion every day.

### **1 Cor 11:24-26 (NKJV)**

<sup>24</sup> and when He had given thanks, He broke *it* and said, "Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me." <sup>25</sup> In the same manner *He* also took the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink *it*, in remembrance of Me." <sup>26</sup> For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes.

### **Matt 26:26-28 (NLT)**

<sup>26</sup> As they were eating, Jesus took some bread and blessed it. Then he broke it in pieces and gave it to the disciples, saying, "Take this and eat it, for this is my body." <sup>27</sup> And he took a cup of wine and gave thanks to God for it. He gave it to them and said, "Each of you drink from it, <sup>28</sup> for this is my blood, which confirms the covenant between God and his people. It is poured out as a sacrifice to forgive the sins of many.

### **1 Corinthians 10:16 (ESV)**

<sup>16</sup> The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ?

### **Acts 2:43 (NLT)**

All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer.

### **Isaiah 53:5 (NIV)**

<sup>5</sup> But He was pierced for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on Him, and by His wounds we are healed.

### **John 1:29 (NKJV)**

<sup>29</sup> The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!
